OPPOSITE AND ABOVE: This bath reveals a number of effective choices, including the stone that wraps the vanities and the top of the tub and the muted, consistent color palette. Placing the vanities on either side of the door reinforced the idea of separate domains for the couple sharing the room. Setting the tub in a niche maximized the square footage and gave the bath natural light and a view.









ABOVE AND OPPOSITE: I am particularly attracted to the fluted element in this bath, which gives an already clean, crisp space an overlay of classical elegance. The vanity's mirrored front adds an aspect of formality, as does the highly polished, reflective surface of the tub.
