HOUSTON — She couldn't sleep. Not now.

Kris Ford-Amofa lay next to her husband in a spare bedroom at her sister's house, thinking once more about the brown water that had slithered under the front door of the first home she had ever owned. The water that swirled around her three children as the family fled, wading up City Green Trail to seek refuge at a neighbor's house. The water that had buckled their living room floor, rotted the drywall and made them homeless. The floodwater that was not covered by their insurance.

More Than a Place For Keeping Socks

Unlike sculptural chairs and glittering chandeliers, dressers are rarely the focal point of a room. But they do offer valuable storage space and can be used for much more than merely concealing underwear in the bedroom.

"We use them in media rooms. living rooms, dining rooms, mudrooms and fovers," said Beth Webb, an Atlanta-based interior designer whose book "An Eve for Beauty: Rooms That Speak to the Senses" (Rizzoli) is out this month. "It's one of the most versatile pieces in our arsenal."

Dressers come in a multitude of shapes, sizes and styles, from long and low to tall and skinny, she noted, and can add a surface for displaying art and objects along with additional storage just about anywhere.

"If you put a mirror over a chest in a foyer, it can become something of great beauty," she said, while the drawers serve as discreet catchalls for items like keys and stationery.


"It's not form versus function." Ms. Webb said. "It's form plus function."


