


CALIFORNIA CALLING

"The client came to us with a very definitive direction of what they wanted based on what they initially gravitated to in our work," says designer Beth Webb about her work inside an expansive Hermosa Beach home she recently designed for a young, active family that love to entertain. "Additionally, she did not wish to have a lot of stuff and had a penchant for textured, soulful spaces. In this respect, we found ourselves speaking the same language which allowed for an easy design dialogue during the whole of the project."
